

Protected Bike Lanes



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WHAT IS A PROTECTED BIKE LANE?

Otherwise known as a CYCLE TRACK, a protected bike lane is physically separated from vehicle traffic.

Protected bike lanes can be separated from the vehicle travel lane by bollards, curb, or parked cars. Similar to a trail, cycle tracks are often more comfortable for people who prefer not to ride with traffic.



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WHAT DOES THE GREEN MEAN?

Green pavement highlights areas where bicycles and cars cross paths. The green pavement alerts drivers, pedestrians and bicyclists to pay extra attention.

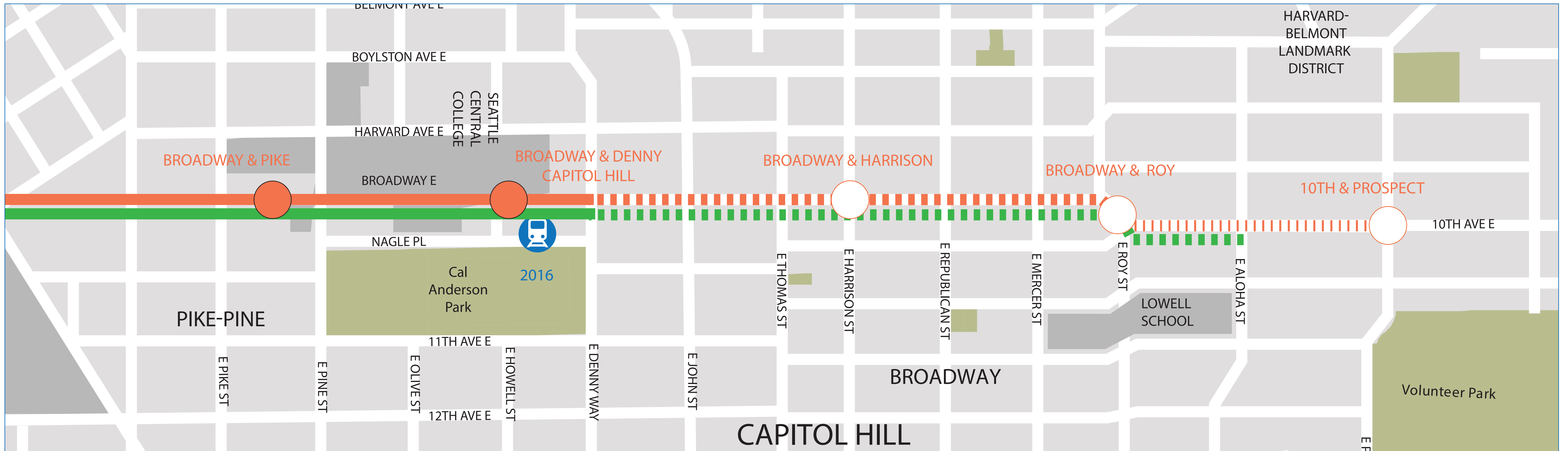


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WHAT IS THE SAFEST WAY TO CROSS TRAIN TRACKS?

Because the track groove is just slightly wider than the typical bike tire, your wheel can easily get stuck. The key to staying safe is to cross at as close to a 90 degree angle as possible. When it's raining, it's often better to walk your bike across.
