Project Update

The [Center City Connector Streetcar](#) project is currently in design. Construction on utility work for the project could begin as early as 2017, provided all funding has been secured. The Environmental Assessment (EA) for the Center City Connector Streetcar was published on May 9, 2016, and is available on the project website. The formal comment period for the EA has ended, but we welcome continued community input by emailing centercitystreetcar@seattle.gov or calling us at 206-615-1070.

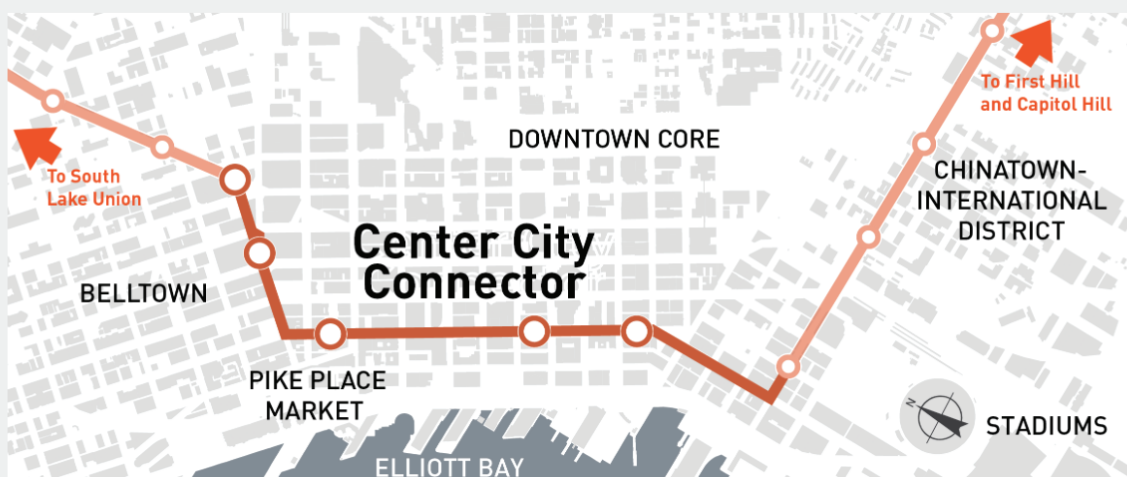
In advance of the Streetcar construction, several utilities located under the project footprint on 1st Avenue need to be relocated. The Center City Connector Streetcar team will be contacting businesses, residents, and property owners along the Streetcar alignment to share additional information as the project progresses.

Upcoming Geotechnical Investigations

Beginning Monday, July 18th, Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) will be conducting geotechnical investigations for the relocation of water and sewer lines. The work is expected to take 3-4 days with work hours of 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM. The work is located in the street right-of-way along 1st Avenue between S. Main Street and S. Jackson Street and on Yesler Way.

During the work you can expect:

- Crews and equipment located in and around the work sites
- Temporary lane closures and markings in the right-of-way
- On-street parking restrictions
- Periodic noise from drilling operations, including engine noise
