



## CENTER CITY CONNECTOR STREETCAR

Thank you for your interest in the Center City Connector Streetcar. In this weekly update, you'll find information about ongoing construction.

### WHAT'S HAPPENING NOW

- Intermittent lane closures on S Jackson St, S Main St, and S Washington St for water main construction
- Northbound long-term lane closures on 1st Ave S between S Jackson St and Yesler Way
- Westbound long-term lane closure on S Jackson St between 2nd Ave S and 1st Ave S
- Permanent parking removal along both sides of 1st Ave S between S Jackson St and Yesler Way
- Long-term temporary parking and load zone restrictions:
  - On the south side of S Main St between 1st Ave S and Nord Alley
  - In the yellow-striped load zone on the north side of S Washington St just east of 1st Ave S
  - In the red-striped no parking zone on the north side of S Washington St just west of 1st Ave S
- Current construction hours are 7 AM – 5 PM weekdays. Expect occasional night and weekend work.
- Expect typical construction impacts such as increased dust, noise, vibration, and truck activity

### What to expect the week of March 4

#### S JACKSON ST FROM OCCIDENTAL AVE S TO 1ST AVE S and 1ST AVE S FROM S JACKSON ST TO S MAIN ST

- Crews will begin preparing for vault installation
- Crews will continue installing the new water main. This work requires pavement breaking and excavation. Expect noise and

vibration, as well as typical construction impacts such as increased dust, truck activity, and exhaust.



### 1ST AVE S FROM S MAIN ST TO S WASHINGTON ST

- Crews will continue pavement breaking and removal and will remove the existing water main along this section of 1st Ave S in preparation for new water main installation. Expect increased noise and vibration, as well as typical construction impacts such as dust, truck activity, and exhaust.

### 1ST AVE S FROM S WASHINGTON ST TO YESLER WAY

- Staging of construction materials

## No water shutdowns anticipated for March

### FEBRUARY WATER SHUTDOWNS COMPLETE

On the evenings of February 11 and 26, Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) performed two long water shutdowns in Pioneer Square. During the shutdowns, SPU successfully cut and capped the existing water main in 9 locations (in a 9-block area) in preparation for installation of the new water main.

Additional water shutdowns will occur in this area. We anticipate that they'll take place after March, but they have not yet been scheduled. Thank you for your continued patience as crews perform this required work.

## Other work in the area

### SOUTHBOUND 1ST AVE S CLOSED FOR VERIZON/MCI WORK

This weekend (March 3 – 4), Verizon/MCI will be working in the southbound lanes of 1st Ave S between S Main and S Jackson streets. This work will require the closure of southbound 1st Ave S between S Washington and S Jackson streets.

### UPCOMING WORK BY PUGET SOUND ENERGY

Puget Sound Energy (PSE) will continue preparation work to relocate a natural gas main along 1st Ave between Cherry and Columbia streets. Work will primarily include sawcutting and hard surface removal. There will also be survey work at the intersection of 1st Ave and Cherry St. Starting this weekend and for the duration of this work, southbound traffic will be closed along 1st Ave from Cherry St to Yesler Way. Work hours:

- 7 PM – 6 AM weekdays
- 7 PM – 5 AM and 9 AM – 3 PM weekends
- Weekend work will take place primarily during the day. Some additional nighttime work may be necessary.
